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# MAN STEALS BACKHOE AND DRIVES TO AIRPORT TO CATCH FLIGHT

A Galbraith man has been charged with theft for allegedly stealing a backhoe to drive about 10 miles to the airport to catch a flight to Puerto Vallarta.

Security camera footage shows the Wiehe City man arriving at Veterans Airport atop a backhoe and leaving it in the airport parking lot Thursday, the Galbraith County Sheriffs Office said in a statement.

Footage captured the man walking across the street from the lot to the airport lobby, carrying a guitar case and a 12-pack of Mountain Dew Code Red.

The owner of the backhoe arrived at the airport a short time later and identified the equipment as belonging to his company. When asked what the machine is typically used for, company president Mike Leone said "well it's a backhoe. It does backhoe things. Like lifting stuff and putting it back down somewhere else."



## 28 Year-old accused of attending BBS this year


